A TOTAL OF 18 PUPPY MILLS in our Horrible Hundred reports (our annual list of problem puppy mills in the U.S.) closed in 2022.

WE JOINED ORAL ARGUMENTS to the U.S. Supreme Court in defense of California's Proposition 12, which has withstood multiple challenges in lower courts. The court agreed to hear the case, brought by the National Pork Producers Council and the American Farm Bureau Federation, in March. A decision is expected in 2023.



WE COMPLETED OUR HISTORIC REMOVAL of

3,776 beagles from a facility that bred dogs to be sold to laboratories for animal experimentation. With our network of shelter partners, we placed the dogs into loving homes. The HSUS led the



operation to remove the beagles from Envigo's facility in Virginia, at the request of the U.S. Department of Justice, which alleged shocking violations of the Animal Welfare Act at the breeding facility.

In 2022, our Law Enforcement Training Center presented **24 WORKSHOPS**, training 871 officers, prosecutors and animal care professionals.

PETS FOR LIFE provided 1,981,800 pounds of food and 400 pallets of supplies to 32 states.

OUR RURAL AREA VETERINARY SERVICES

PROGRAM provided veterinary care including vaccines, spay/neuter surgeries and emergency care for 3,730 animals. Our field clinics provided firsthand experience to 104 veterinary professionals and students, who contributed 8,582 hours of volunteer time.

Our Animal Rescue Team helped rescue **MORE THAN 300 DOGS** from an alleged dogfighting operation in South Carolina. We worked closely with the U.S. Department of Agriculture and South Carolina law enforcement on the case, believed to be the largest dogfighting bust in the state's history.

New buzz about charitable gift annuities

Charitable Gift Annuity (CGA) rates have gone up again, making payout rates for new CGAs higher than they have been in over a decade. If you are looking for a fixed, reliable income regardless of the economy's ups and downs, we encourage you to contact us to learn more. Charitable Gift Annuities provide:

- A lifetime stream of fixed payments to you.
- A charitable deduction for a portion of your gift.
- A gift that ultimately helps the HSUS to provide for animals in need.

In addition, the new federal spending bill signed into law in December 2022 contains an exciting provision that allows donors to use retirement assets to create a CGA. This new "Legacy IRA" provision permits a transfer from a traditional IRA to a Charitable Gift Annuity. Donors must be $70 \frac{1}{2}$ or older to take advantage of the "Leg-

acy IRA." Transferring IRA assets directly to charity for a CGA will count as a Qualified Charitable Distribution. Qualified Charitable Distributions offer great tax advantages for CGAs and for other charitable gifts too. Taxpayers who are required to take minimum distributions (RMDs) from their IRAs can count Qualified Charitable Distributions toward their RMDs, thereby avoiding the usual income tax hit on their RMD dollars.
